Reading Bills

Key:

S = An "S" before a House or Senate bill indicates a Substitute Bill. This means the bill was amended from the original version

2S = A two will always be followed by an "S." This marker indicates a Second Substitute Senate or House Bill. This means a bill was amended by a second committee, usually a fiscal committee.

E = An "E" indicates an engrossed bill. This means the bill was amended on the floor of the chamber before it was passed out of the house of origin.

The Legislature is moving in to the final phase of session with opposite House committee cut off Friday. Non-budget bills must have passed out of the opposite chamber policy committee or they are dead for this session. In other words House bills must pass out of Senate policy committee and vice verse. Both the House and Senate presented versions of the General Fund and Transportation budgets. They will pass these versions out of their respective chambers and then final negotiations between the two chambers will proceed, hopefully concluding with a final budget deal by March 13. The Legislature will spend most of next week on the Floor passing opposite chamber bills and negotiating final concurrence language on any disputed legislation.

Momentum around solar issues associated with the incentive program and system leasing (HB 1301/ HB 2176) appear to have stalled and it does not look like any further Legislative activity will occur on this issue.

The High Tech RD tax incentives remain alive however the Senate proposed narrowing the program to just companies with less than \$50 million in revenue. This has caused enormous controversy and could cause the entire program to die this session.

# BILL TRACKING DETAILS

E2S1301 <u>CLEAN ENERGY JOBS</u> MORRIS

House Committee on Finance (originally sponsored by Representatives Morris, Ryu, McCoy, Hudgins, Morrell, and Pollet)

Declares an intent to: (1) Attract a vibrant clean technology sector to the state; and

(2) Improve the use of tax incentives, created in the act, by state residents and businesses, streamline program administration, and incubate the development of clean energy technology by modifying the existing renewable energy investment cost recovery incentive program.

# S2059 <u>ELIGIBLE RENEWABLE RESOURCES</u>

MORRIS

House Committee on Technology & Economic Development (originally sponsored by Representative Morris)

Requires an investor-owned utility, at the request of a nonresidential electric customer, to create a tariff that includes a standard contract to allow the customer and other interested nonresidential customers to purchase voluntarily renewable resources in one megawatt-hour units.

Requires the governing board of a consumer-owned utility, upon request of an electric customer of a consumer-owned utility, to create a tariff schedule or contract that allows the customer to purchase voluntarily renewable resources in one megawatt-hour units. Requires a customer requesting to purchase voluntarily renewable resources to make a deposit with the utility to cover the cost of work hours at the electric utility to develop the tariff.

# S2176 LEASED ENERGY SYSTEMS MORRIS

House Committee on Technology & Economic Development (originally sponsored by Representative Morris)

Authorizes an electric utility to offer a leased energy program that must offer to customers across all rate classes the opportunity to lease from the electric utility a renewable energy system that will be installed on the customer's property.

Requires the department of ecology to conduct an assessment of the environmental consequences, throughout the product lifecycle, associated with leased energy systems and energy storage systems installed in this state containing hazardous materials, rare earth minerals, and other commercially valuable materials.

Requires the utilities and transportation commission to publish a list of financing models being offered by investor-owned utilities or third-party vendors registered as competitive electrical companies.

Requires investor-owned utilities and third-party vendors offering leased energy systems, upon request of the utilities and transportation commission, to provide information on the financial terms of leased energy systems currently under contract.

ATE ENERGY POLICY MORRIS

House Committee on Technology & Economic Development (originally sponsored by Representatives Morris, Ormsby, Fey, and Hudgins)

Requires the joint committee on energy supply and energy conservation to make recommendations to the energy committees of the legislature on ways to improve the effectiveness and implementation of the existing law and policies that would further the renewable energy and energy efficiency goals for utilities after 2020.

Requires the Washington State University energy program to conduct a resource assessment on the amount of new energy resources that could be made available with a high-efficiency cogeneration policy or a thermal heating efficiency policy to assist the joint committee deliberations in developing new energy performance standards after 2020.

# 6258 <u>Conservation by utility</u> Ericksen

Senators Ericksen, Chase, Sheldon, Brown, and Honeyford

Revises the energy independence act to allow conservation achieved by a qualifying utility in excess of its biennial target to be applied as a direct credit toward any of the next three subsequent biennial targets, such that no more than fifty percent of any biennial target

may be met with excess conservation savings.

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# NATURAL GAS/FUEL TAXES

KING

Senate Committee on Transportation (originally sponsored by Senators King, Eide, and Kline)

Imposes transportation taxes and fees on natural gas, the sale of compressed natural gas, or liquefied natural gas, used as transportation fuel by a motor vehicle.

Clarifies for future use the appropriate taxation of natural gas, when used as a transportation fuel, in a manner similar to gasoline and diesel.

Requires the department of licensing to convene a work group that includes, at a minimum, representatives from the department of transportation, the trucking industry, manufacturers of compressed natural gas and liquefied natural gas, and other stakeholders as deemed necessary to: (1) Evaluate the annual license fee in lieu of fuel tax under RCW 82.38.075 to determine a fee that more closely represents the average consumption of vehicles by weight; and

(2) Develop a transition plan to move vehicles powered by liquefied natural gas, compressed natural gas, and propane from the annual license fee in lieu of fuel tax to the fuel tax under RCW 82.38.030.

### INNOVATE WASHINGTON

CHASE

Senate Committee on Trade & Economic Development (originally sponsored by Senator Chase)

Requested by Washington State Department of

Commerce

Dissolves the operations of innovate Washington and transfers the innovate Washington facilities to Washington State University. Transfers certain personal property located in Spokane to Washington State University.

Requires innovate Washington to work with the department of enterprise services to: (1) Have all real property assigned to Washington State University;

- (2) Have the master lease for the Spokane technology center building in Spokane assigned to Washington State University; and
- (3) Have all data relating to the operations of innovate Washington transferred to the department of commerce.
