

2024 Legislative Session Weekly Report CleanTech Alliance January 26, 2024

Week Three

We have now completed week three of the 60-day legislative session, marking one-third of its duration. By Wednesday, January 31st, all bills without fiscal implications need to have passed their respective policy committees to remain alive. Following this deadline, attention will turn to the budget committees, which are set to convene over the upcoming weekend in preparation for the fiscal cutoff on February 5th. Subsequent to this, both the House and Senate will engage in floor votes to pass bills out of their respective chambers. The House of Origin cutoff is February 13th.

Key Issues Before the Legislature - Week 3:

- **Limiting Natural Gas to Decarbonize Energy Grid** HB 1589 aims to decarbonize Washington State's energy grid by limiting the expansion of natural gas services. Proponents argue it's a necessary step to combat climate change, noting natural gas accounts for a significant portion of Seattle's carbon emissions. However, opponents raise concerns about the cost impact on consumers, particularly in underserved communities. The bill passed the House (52-45) and moved to the Senate for further discussion. - **Child Care and Tax Preferences** The House Finance Committee held a public hearing on two pieces of legislation related to tax preferences and childcare. <u>HB 1716</u> by Rep. Alicia Rule (D-Blaine) would give businesses that provide child care a credit on their business and occupation taxes. <u>HB 2322</u>, sponsored by Representative Senn (D-Mercer Island), would require companies that get a preferential B&O tax rate to provide child care for their employees. - Climate Commitment Act Charges on Utility Bills -A bill was discussed to require utility bills to reflect charges related to the Climate Commitment Act. This bill aims to address climate change by setting greenhouse gas limits for companies. Republican Senator Drew McEwen (R-Shelton) sponsored the bill, emphasizing the importance of consumer understanding of these charges. Read more here.
- Linkage of Washington's Carbon Market with the California-Quebec Carbon Market-SB 6058/HB 2201 are Department of Ecology request companion bills that have garnered a lot of attention this session. As a reminder, an alternative goes to the voters on the ballot. On Thursday, the House vehicle of the bill passed out of committee (9-4). There is a still a question on whether or not this proposal would constitute an alternative to I 2117. Read more hete.
- **Transit-Oriented Development** -<u>HB 2160</u>, which requires larger cities to allow denser housing near train or bus stops. This bill, like a previous failed attempt, faces challenges due to certain aspects like affordability requirements, displacement safeguards, and parking limits. This bill had a <u>public hearing</u> on Thursday in the House Capital Budget Committee. Click <u>here</u> to learn more.

- **Initiatives Update:** As of Thursday, all six initiatives were certified by the Secretary of State's office. <u>Initiative 2113</u> (police pursuits), <u>Initiative 2117</u> (Cap-and-Trade), <u>Initiative 2081</u> (parental rights relating to their children's public school education), <u>Initiative 2109</u> (capital gains tax), <u>Initiative 2111</u> (banning state income tax), and <u>Initiative 2124</u> (long-term care insurance). CleanTech Alliance Specifics

The Senate version of the carbon market linkage bill (SB 6058) saw executive action in the Senate Environment, Energy & Technology Committee on Friday, January 26th with a do pass recommendation given on the proposed substitute, and the House version (HB 2201) passed out of the House Environment & Energy Committee on Thursday, January 25th in its substitute form.

Senator Shewmake's <u>SB 6092</u> (concerning disclosure of greenhouse gas emissions) is scheduled for executive session on <u>Tuesday, January 30th</u> in the Senate Environment, Energy & Technology Committee.

Representative Shavers' bill (<u>HB 1924</u>) works to require the state to support technologies like fusion. The bill has been referred to the Rule Committee.

Representative Ramel's thermal energy networks bill for gas utilities (<u>HB 2131</u>) passed out of the House Environment & Energy Committee on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>January 23rd</u> with a do pass recommendation on a <u>proposed substitute</u>. It has now been referred to the Capital Budget Committee. The Senate version (<u>SB 6138</u>) was heard in the Senate Environment, Energy & Technology Committee on Wednesday, January 24th but has yet to be scheduled for executive session.

Representative Slatter's bill (<u>HB 2073</u>) regarding greenhouse gasses from sources other than methane and carbon dioxide passed out of committee in its <u>substitute form</u> during the same hearing and has been referred to Appropriations.

Representative Mena's bill (<u>HB 2000</u>) which works to renew Washington's international leadership legislation, was heard in the House Appropriations Committee on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>January 25th</u> and is scheduled for executive session on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>January 31st</u>.

This week, <u>HB 2049</u> (Re-WRAP Act) was referred to the House Appropriations Committee and we expect it to be scheduled for a hearing sometime in the next week or so. While the House bill will be the vehicle to continue, the Senate version of the Re-WRAP Act (<u>SB 6005</u>) was heard in the Senate Environment, Energy & Technology Committee on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>January 23rd</u>. In addition, <u>HB 2144</u> (deposit return program) was referred to the House Finance Committee and is scheduled for a hearing on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>February 1st</u> at 8:00 AM.

We continue to monitor <u>HB 2401</u> (providing for the responsible management of refrigerant gasses with a higher global warming potential than carbon dioxide used in appliances or other infrastructure), which was heard in the House Environment & Energy Committee on <u>Monday</u>, <u>January 22nd</u>. It is scheduled for executive session on <u>Monday</u>, <u>January 29th</u>.

Senator Mullet has introduced legislation aiming to provide a state business and occupation tax exemption to encourage clean technology manufacturing in Washington (SB 6243). It was heard in the Senate Business, Financial Services, Gaming & Trade Committee on Thursday, January 25th but has yet to be scheduled for executive session. We will continue to work with proponents of this legislation to try to move it forward.

We will continue to monitor <u>HB 1589</u> (supporting Washington's clean energy economy and transitioning to a clean, affordable, and reliable energy future), sponsored by Rep. Doglio. The bill passed out of the House (52-45) on Monday, January 22nd, and is now scheduled to be heard in the Senate Environment, Energy & Technology Committee on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>January 31st</u>. Proponents and opponents continue to negotiate language as the bill moves through the legislative process.

HB 2020, sponsored by Representative Timmons, authorizes the Military Department to administer a program for emergency assistance to county governments and federally recognized tribes that experience public infrastructure damage due to a natural, technological, or human-caused disaster. This bill had a public hearing in front of Innovation, Community & Economic Development, & Veterans on Ianuary 10th and SHB 2020 was voted out of committee on Ianuary 16th with a do pass recommendation. The bill was referred to Appropriations where it awaits further consideration.

The final bill I want to flag this week is <u>HB 2069</u>, concerning the sale of biogenic carbon dioxide and other coproducts of biogas processing. Introduced by Representative Mosbrucker, the bill was heard in the House Environment & Energy Committee on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>January 23rd</u> and is scheduled for executive session on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>January 30th</u>.
